WE WON'T BE ROBBED!



FIREFIGHTERS SHOW STRENGTH OF ANGER OVER GOVERNMENT PENSION ATTACK

Firefighters across the country walked out for 3 consecutive periods of strike action at the weekend in protest against devastating pension attacks being pushed through by the Westminster Government. The strikes came after the refusal by the Government to make a revised set of proposals despite 3 years of negotiations.

"It is purely the failure of the government to present revised proposals that has led to these strikes. Now the government is walking away from talks. It is utterly irresponsible", said the union's general secretary Matt Wrack.

"The FBU has never walked away from discussion and our members have been patient and measured in their approach, but we will not simply stand by while government imposes a pension scheme that is totally unworkable, unaffordable, unsustainable and unfair."

The proposals put forward by the Government would see firefighters' retirement age rise to 60 despite studies showing that fitness demands on those working in the fire services are no

longer achievable after the age of 55. Hundreds of firefighters would then face the risk of being sacked simply because of declining health as they get older.

The government has also imposed a third year of employee contribution increases, meaning most firefighters must now pay at least 14.2% of their salary in pension contributions, or over £4,000 a year.

South West Official Tam McFarlane said "The political hypocrisy being shown by Government ministers is a disgrace. During the recent floods politicians praised us to our face whilst robbing us of our pensions behind our back. Now we have been left with no choice but to fight back, and politicians better wake up to the fact that we are united, strong and we won't give up".

The union has made it clear to Government that we remain committed to a negotiated settlement and are available to meet at any time, including at short notice, to receive and consider any improvements.

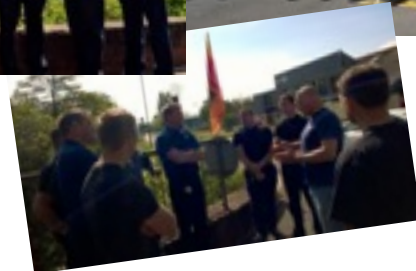
