You may have seen the news that massive cuts are being proposed to the frontline of your local Fire & Rescue Service. These cuts include the loss of over 140 full time Firefighter jobs and would see the downgrading of 6 Fire Engines and a vital aerial appliance (used to make high reach rescues and fight fires from above). **The cuts would also see the downgrading of 3 entire Fire Stations.**

Cuts on this scale are unprecedented and Fire Crews are deeply concerned that they will severely compromise our ability to do our job and protect the public. We understand that times are difficult and money is tight, but we believe these cuts go too far and that the current situation cannot continue without risking the long term safety of the public.

The cuts would mean that the amount of frontline Firefighters covering **Plymouth** would be cut almost *in half*. The City would have 3 Fire Engines, an aerial appliance (which covers vulnerable areas such as Derriford Hospital) and 2 entire Fire Stations *downgraded*. This would drastically reduce our ability to respond and deal with incidents in the way that we currently do.

Everyone who witnessed the severe floods in our Region will understand that the Fire Service has been stretched to the limit and sometimes beyond. Your Fire Service has suffered severe cuts for a number of years and if this latest set is forced through we believe our ability to serve you in times of need will be severely compromised.

The cuts are currently out for public consultation and we are asking for your help in making the politicians responsible think again. Your voice is important.
